



PE and Sports Premium Review 2018/19

At Pleasant Street School we believe that PE and sport makes an important contribution to the health and well-being of our children. Sporting excellence and participation, alongside strong cultural opportunities, go hand in hand with high academic standards.

The Sports PE & Sports Premium has helped ensure a wide range of activities are delivered in school, which aim to engage and inspire all children. We are also committed to ensure that children receive 2 hours per week of high quality well-planned opportunities for physical activity (including residential trips, themed sports days and daily running sessions). Over the year each child will participate in games, athletics, dance, gymnastics and swimming lessons.

The tables below show the attainment of pupils in PE and the increases in pupils working at Age Related Expectations in relation to 2017-18.

Headlines

The level of pupils who are participating in one extra-curricular sporting activity is 47.8%, there are a greater percentage of Pupil Premium children who are participating in extra-curricular activities; 52%. This has been achieved through greater engagement of targeted groups from the year prior.

Class 1

There are 30 pupils within Class 1, with a 17:13 split between males and females. The class have a 67% participation in extra-curricular sporting clubs (22/30), and 50% of pupils are taking part in more than one extra-curricular sporting clubs. There are 17% of pupils who have represented the school at an inter-school competition.

Pupil Premium pupils that are participating in one activity is at 70% (7/10). The level of Pupil Premium children taking part in more than one activity is at 60% (6/10). There is 10% of the Pupil Premium cohort who has represented the school at an inter-school competition.

Class 2

There are 28 pupils within Class 2, with an 18:10 split between males and females. The class have a 36% participation in extra-curricular sporting clubs (10/28), and 18% (5/28) of pupils are taking part in more than one extra-curricular sporting clubs. There are 14% (4/28) of pupils who have represented the school at an inter-school competition.

Pupil Premium pupils that are participating in one activity is at 40% (4/10). The level of Pupil Premium children taking part in more than one activity is at 20% (2/10). There is 10% of the Pupil Premium cohort who has represented the school at an inter-school competition.

Class 3

There are 30 pupils within Class 3, with a 15:15 split between males and females. The class have a 50% participation in extra-curricular sporting clubs (15/30), and 20% of pupils are taking part in more than one extra-curricular sporting clubs. There are 13% (4/30) of pupils who have represented the school at an inter-school competition.

Pupil Premium pupils that are participating in one activity is at 25% (1/4).

Class 4

There are 25 pupils within Class 4, with a 10:14 split between males and females. The class have a 36% participation in extra-curricular sporting clubs (9/25), and 16% (4/25) of pupils are taking part in more than one extra-curricular sporting clubs. There are 4% of pupils who have represented the school at an inter-school competition.

Pupil Premium pupils that are participating in one activity is at 60% (6/10). The level of Pupil Premium children taking part in more than one activity is at 30% (3/10). There is 10% of the pupil premium cohort who has represented the school at an inter-school competition.

Class 5

There are 29 pupils within Class 5, with a 14/15 split between males and females. The class have a 31% participation in extra-curricular sporting clubs (9/29), and 17% of pupils are taking part in more than one extra-curricular sporting clubs. There are 31% of pupils who have represented the school at an inter-school competition.

Pupil Premium pupils that are participating in one activity is at 29% (5/17). The level of Pupil Premium children taking part in more than one activity is at 6%. There is 47% of the Pupil Premium cohort who has represented the school at an inter-school competition.

Class 6

There are 30 pupils within Class 6, with a 19:11 split between males and females. The class have a 67% participation in extra-curricular sporting clubs (20/30), and 37% of pupils are taking part in more than one extra-curricular sporting clubs. There are 37% of pupils who have represented the school at an inter-school competition.

Pupil Premium pupils that are participating in one activity is at 89% (8/9). The level of Pupil Premium children taking part in more than one activity is at 56% (5/9). There is 56% of the Pupil Premium cohort who has represented the school at an inter-school competition.
