



Remote Learning Guidance

Thank you for the work you are doing with your child to support their learning and progress whilst school is only open to critical worker and vulnerable children. We appreciate how difficult this is for parents; especially those managing home learning alongside their day job.

We understand that remote learning brings many challenges, the following suggestions might help:

- Support your child to get into a routine by setting up a simple timetable of the same or similar hours to complete work. This will especially help families where there is more than one pupil in the household or devices need to be shared. The daily morning Zoom is perfect for setting a routine for the day.
- Discuss with your child times when they need adult support and time when your child can work independently (for example when listening to the Loom video inputs from the teacher) this is especially important for parents who are also trying to work from home.
- Structure activities so they alternate between physical and digital work so that the children are not spending long continuous periods on devices. E.g. try to have a balance between video inputs and working in books, time on games such as TT Rockstars and a PE video.
- Set and create a reward system, we can provide stickers and reward charts if needed, please email and we will arrange.
- Regular communication with the class teacher and support is important, we are here to help and we will be able to advise on breaking down barriers to learning and to support with developing systems that will support you whilst you are juggling working from home and supporting your child's learning.
- The Government guidance is that pupils in KS1 should access a minimum of 3 hours of learning and pupils in KS2 a minimum of 4 hours. This does not have to be continuous but it is vital that all families aim for this to ensure our children's progress and future life chances are not overly harmed by national lockdown.
