Reading Buddies

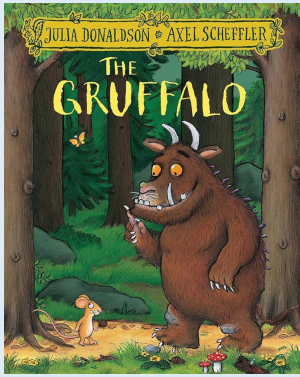

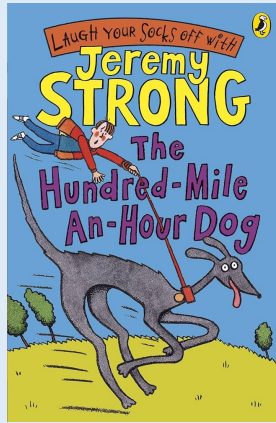
Librarians

We have new librarians from Y5 and Y6 who are currently being trained on how to check books in and out and organise the library, say hello to them next time you visit.

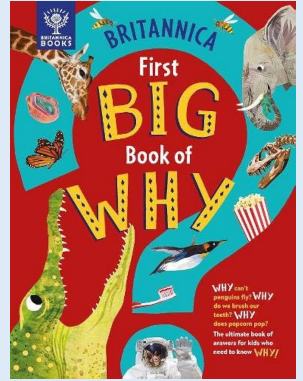
READING RECOMMENDATIONS



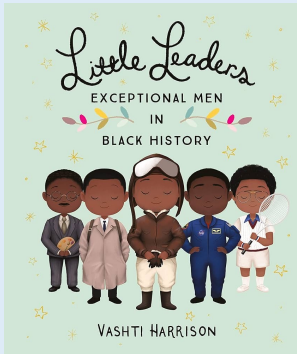
I like The Gruffalo because it has so many different animals, I have it at home and I love it! **Kairo, Y2**

I like this book, the First Big Book of Why because it tells me about many things and I like the pictures. **Sahand, Y2**



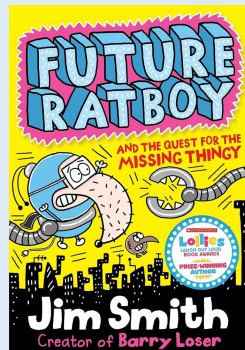

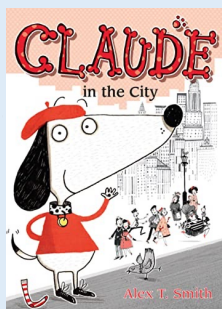

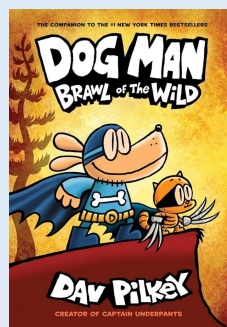
I like Future Ratboy because it is imaginative, fun to read and the story was creative. I liked that it was set in the future and that the characters are funny.

I liked our class book Claude, he has a medal. **Ana, Y1**

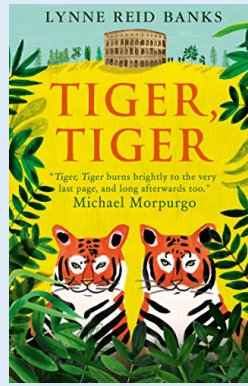




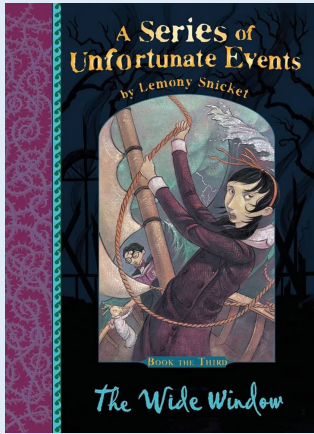
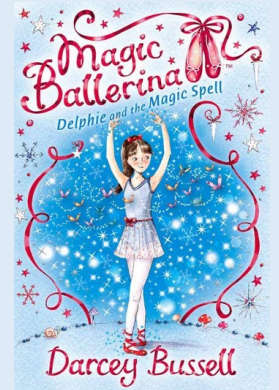
I like our class book Pugs of the Frozen North. The pugs are adorable and funny and the illustrations are beautiful. **Iyad, Y2**
