1. Introduction

Pleasant Street Primary School is committed to supporting the health, wellbeing, and learning readiness of our pupils. The Breakfast Club provides a safe, welcoming, and structured environment where children can enjoy a nutritious breakfast and a positive start to the school day.

2. Aims of the Breakfast Club

- To provide children with a healthy breakfast to start the day.
 - To promote a calm and positive start to the morning.
 - To encourage social interaction and positive behaviour.
 - To support families by providing before-school childcare.
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3. Allocation of Places

- Breakfast Club has a maximum of **70 places per term**, which limits availability.
 - **Places are allocated via a parent/carer application** completed **at the end of each term** via ParentApps for the following term. Applications are **not issued at half term**, for example, across Autumn Term, Spring Term and Summer term.
 - Allocation is made on a **first come, first served basis** once applications are received.
 - **Places do not automatically roll over from term to term**, but they **will continue across half terms** within the same term.
 - A **waiting list** will be maintained when all places are full.
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4. Attendance and Waiting List Management

- If a child **does not attend Breakfast Club for two consecutive weeks** without prior notice, their place will be **automatically withdrawn**.

- Withdrawn places will be offered to children on the **waiting list** in order of application.
- Parents and carers are encouraged to notify the school of any absences to avoid losing a place unnecessarily.

5. Behaviour Expectations

Children attending Breakfast Club are expected to adhere to the standards of behaviour outlined in the **Pleasant Street Primary School Behaviour Policy**.

- Staff will promote positive, respectful, and inclusive behaviour.
- Repeated or serious breaches of behaviour may result in a child's place being **reviewed or withdrawn**.

6. Fees and Funding

- Currently, there are **no fees** for Breakfast Club.
- Staffing for Breakfast Club will be funded by school direct.
- Food available to children at Breakfast Club is funded through a **grant from Greggs**, this includes a variety of cereals, toast, beans, spaghetti hoops, eggs, fruit and juice.
- Any future changes to fees or funding will be communicated to parents and carers in advance.

7. Monitoring and Review

This policy will be reviewed **annually**, or sooner if there are changes to funding, demand, or operational arrangements.
