



## Language Resource Parent Letter Summer 2026

We would like to share some information about the curriculum that we will be covering this term.

### **Speech Work:**

Targets from speech work will be reinforced in speech sessions given by Mrs. Davies and Mrs. Casey. We have devised a diary sheet to show what speech work has been carried out in the Language Resource, Home school and at home to ensure consistency and communication between the settings. The children's speech book should be taken into Pleasant Street the days the children attend and then into home school the days the children attend their main school.

As well as adult planned activities, the children will also have opportunities to develop their learning and interests through child-initiated activities in the classroom. As we have pupils of different ages and abilities in Class 7 the activities are planned accordingly. The activities consider the differences that each child brings to our class.

### **English:**

Children will have the opportunities to develop their communication and language skills when exploring the text below:

Summer 1 Mr. Gumpy's outing by John Burningham

Summer 2 Little Red by Bethan Woolvin

The children will look at a key 'hook' from the text i.e. a range of resources from the story/clothing/images etc., As a class the children will be able to express their thoughts and ideas about the story. They will discuss their favourite parts of the text and images, make predictions, use their inference skills, sequence the story and develop their own individual stories. The children will also have opportunities to engage in role-play around the story and hot seating of characters.

There will be writing opportunities for different purposes these will include letters, invitations, instructions and plan and read their own version of a story. Children's phonics skills will be supported and developed through the use of sound/word mats, gestures, teacher modelling and through the wide range of phonic schemes that the children use in homeschools. Fine motor skills will be developed through a wide range of activities including chalk, water and sand play, tweezer games, cutting and construction opportunities plus a wide range of other in the moment activities.

In addition to daily English based activities, each day the children have 'Talk Time' at the beginning of the school day to focus on developing individual speech and language targets in different contexts. Later in the day the class will further enhance speaking and listening skills through speech and language games which will also develop the children's communication and language skills.

### **Mathematics:**

Adult initiated/led and child-initiated activities will focus on basic skills (number and place value) using Key performance indicators. We believe that all children should achieve the best they are capable of and adapt our learning accordingly, so ambition is achieved by all. The type of activities will include Counting (forwards and backwards), recognizing, sequencing and writing numbers, using language of 'more' and 'fewer/less' to compare amounts, using objects and number knowledge to add, subtract, multiply and divide/share. Understanding and using symbols '+', '-', and '='. Using mathematic skills and knowledge to reason and problem solve.

**Music: Listen and Appraise:**

Summer 1: 2000's— "Pop, Rock, Rap and a mix of All!"

Summer 2: Folk Music from our city

The children will be listening to and exploring the musical styles of different artists during these topics. The children will learn some background information about the artists and how they have influenced their genre. Through class discussion the children will be able to express their feelings and preferences.
