School Uniform Policy

Aims

At Pleasant Street Primary School, we believe that a school uniform promotes a sense of belonging, supports equality, and helps create a positive learning environment. Our uniform policy has been developed in line with Department for Education guidance to ensure that it is practical, inclusive and represents value for money for families.

Uniform Expectations

Pupils are expected to wear the agreed school uniform each day. Uniform should be clean, safe and suitable for school activities. The school will keep compulsory branded items to a minimum and allow parents to purchase generic items from a range of retailers wherever possible.

Affordability

The Governing Board is committed to ensuring that the cost of school uniform remains reasonable. When reviewing uniform requirements, the school will consider affordability and seek to minimise unnecessary expense for families.

Equality and Inclusion

The school will ensure that uniform requirements are applied fairly and take account of pupils' religious beliefs, cultural backgrounds, disabilities and individual needs. Reasonable adjustments will be made where appropriate.

Second-Hand Uniform

Good-quality second-hand uniform will be made available to families wherever possible. Information about obtaining second-hand uniform will be provided to parents and carers.

Non-Compliance

Where a pupil is unable to wear the correct uniform, the school will work sensitively with parents and carers to understand and address any issues. No pupil will be disadvantaged in their education because of difficulties meeting uniform requirements.

Monitoring and Review

This policy will be reviewed periodically by the Governing Board to ensure continued compliance with Department for Education guidance and to maintain affordability for families.
